

# MINUTES FROM A MEETING OF THE HINES COMMON COUNCIL July 12, 2022

#### Present:

Councilor Quick called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

I. Councilor Quick led the flag salute.

### II. Approval of July 12, 2022 Agenda

Councilor Beers made a motion to approve the July 12, 2022 agenda as presented. Councilor Brizendine seconded the motion. All ayes, motion carried.

### III. Approval of Minutes from June 14 and June 21, 2022

Councilor Allison made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from June 14 and June 21, 2022. Councilor Beers seconded the motion. All ayes, motion carried.

# IV. Accounts Payable for June 30 and July 12, 2022

Councilor Shepherd questioned the payment for Laura Eckstein Law and why was it for May, June and July. Administrator Letham explained that the Eckstein's had a family emergency and had not been able to provide services during the timeframe. The hours have been "banked" and will extend the period of performance. Councilor Quick asked about the Admin Support Fee payable to Civic Plus Administrator Letham explained that this payment is for three invoices. One is an annual admin fee, we also paid to work with one of their attorneys and we paid to have Municode (bought by CivicPlus) review all our code to make sure it is current with State code and to insert links to State code. Councilor Shepherd asked about the additional payment to CivicPlus. Administrator Letham explained that last year when the new zoning ordinance was passed, we will have them upload the zoning ordinance and put it in our code. This will make the ordinance searchable, which we have never had before. Councilor Beers made a motion to approve the Accounts Payable for June 30, 2022 in the amount of \$1,225.00 and for July 12, 2022 in the amount of \$40,185.04. Councilor Brizendine seconded the motion. All ayes, motion carried.

# V. Public Comment: Non-Agenda Items Only (Speaking Time May Be Limited)

# VI. Department Head Reports

Jerry Lewellen, Public Works Superintendent – Pumping about 1.5M gallons of water/day. Jones well is still offline. Bell Electric will be here to look at the solenoid. It is not resetting itself. Lagoons are pumping about 145K gallons/day. Sprayed the weeds around the lagoon. The new brush beater is here and works well. There

was a water line break on Jones, an old line. They are thinking to tie into the new line. The merry-go-round was broken beyond repair. Randy has been on vacation since July 4<sup>th</sup>. *Councilor Brizendine* asked about finishing the water project. Jerry advised all the new lines are in, they just have some tie-ins to complete.

Ryan DeLange, Police Chief – They had 176 calls for service, including forty-one traffic stops. Most calls are thefts. Still have a transient problem. They are starting to gather at the Park. Officer Mitchell was involved in a pursuit. They finally caught the juvenile at his home. Officer Mitchell also dealt with a shots fired call. Someone waving a gun at others. An arrest was made. He is also working a suspicious death case. New Police Officer position is open and posted. There are some people in the area that are starting to carry BB guns. They are carrying them concealed. It is not considered a weapon. They are working with the DA's office to see if there is anything that can be done. The new software is working great! Rattlesnakes are out and bad, be careful. Councilor Brizendine asked if the City could issue an ordinance about BB guns or anything that fires a projectile. Chief DeLange and Administrator Letham are both going to research to see if there is anything the City can do about this.

#### Kirby Letham, City Administrator -

- Caselle Original plans did not include new water meters throughout the City. However, the old meters and meter reading software failed. The decision was made to replace all the meters and meter reading software as well as the billing software. The decision was made to switch our billing software to Caselle. They will be on-site for training August 8<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup>. We hope to be online and using the new software by the end of August. We hope to start reading and bill usage this fall. We will notify residents prior to doing so.
- Position with the police department is open. Applications are available at City Hall, WorkSource Oregon, and eventually with Indeed.
- Last week Councilor Beers contacted City Hall to advise that there was a sewage leak in the parking
  lot in front of Rite Aid. Most of the development in that area is on a private sewer system. There is a
  private lift station that pumps the sewage from that area to the city system. It was discovered the system
  was jammed. It has been cleaned out and is working again. The property owners have been notified
  that they need to update their system.
- Brush, weeds and grasses are out of control. Councilor Shepherd made a list of properties where it
  needs to be addressed. Administrator Letham and Chief Spence have contacted property owners to
  get this taken care of.

#### VII. COUNCIL BUSINESS

- a. FEMA Silvies Phase 2 Floodplain Study Presentation Wendy Shaw, FEMA Engineer for Region X. In the previous presentation she spoke about the engineering aspect of the project. This presentation is to explain what happens now. Also from FEMA is Donald Syriani, Brett LaPlante, Scott Van Hoff and Dennis Jeney. Phase 1 dealt more with the County, Phase 2 deals more with the cities of Hines and Burns and the Reservation. She discussed the update to the floodplain map, the impact to flood insurance, the impact it could have on development.
- b. Business License Application: K&J Construction & Landscaping, LLC Joe Witzel Dryscaping, etc. Councilor Allison made a motion to approve the business license for K&J Construction. Councilor Brizendine second the motion. All ayes, motion carried.
- c. Community Outreach Programs Roxane Worley, Sheriff's Office Lt. Worley explained that the outreach program is help teach a women's self-defense class to be offered to teenagers and women in the community. Training will be conducted by law enforcement. Washington County is currently offering this training and is working with the Harney County Sheriff's Office to develop this program. There would be a focus on situational awareness and physical self-defense techniques. The Sheriff's Office will be applying for grants to help fund this class. Lt. Worley thanked the City for allowing her to present to the City Council. Councilor Allison asked about fees for the training. Lt. Worley explained it would be offered free of charge. Council members mentioned how it is very much needed during these times.

- e. New Hines Pine Mill Owners Roger and Shani Hodge Mr. and Mrs. Hodge introduced themselves to the Council. Mrs. Hodge said they are "Portland Refugees." They visited in 2020 during the HC Fair. They noticed that people here were "living life" and being kind to one another. They visited since then. They had started looking at residential properties, and then saw the Hines Pine Mill House listed. On Friday August 12<sup>th</sup> from 3:00p 6:00p they would like to host a picnic and open house for former Edward Hines and Railroad employees. On Saturday August 13<sup>th</sup> from 11:00a 3:00p they would like to host an open house for the community.
- d. Donation Request: Burns Paiute Pow-Wow Anita Hawley Ms. Hawley was not able to be present. The Burns Paiute Pow-Wow & Lacrosse Games will be August 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> at the Harney County Fairgrounds. They are asking for a donation of TLT funds to help support the event. Councilor Brizendine suggested donating \$250 of TLT funds for the event. Councilor Shepherd made a motion to donate \$500.00 to the Burns Paiute Pow-Wow and Lacrosse Games. Councilor Allison seconded the motion. All ayes, motion carried.
- f. Golf Course Agreement Review: Valley Golf Club James Howden, President Mr. Howden was not able to attend. Administrator Letham told the Council that they all have copies of the agreement in their packets and if they'd like to take the time to read it, they can re-visit the topic at the next meeting. He pointed out paragraphs #3 and #5 for their review. Paragraph #3 discusses the possibility of the Golf Club purchasing the property from the City. Administrator Letham explained that the land was donated with the stipulation that it had to be used for recreation purposes. Ryan DeLange spoke up and said as a resident he believes that the City should retain ownership of the property in case land values increase in the future. Councilor Brizendine believes paragraph #3 should be removed from the agreement as the Golf Club has had many years in which to approach the City about purchasing the land. Councilor Shepherd asked if it benefits the City. Administrator Letham explained that he believes it benefits the City as they hold tournaments during the year that bring in visitors from outside that spend money while they are here. Councilor Allison said that under paragraph #6, the Golf Club should be responsible for maintaining the well and pump as part of the required maintenance. This will move forward to the next meeting.
- g. SCA Allotment: North Saginaw Street Paving Project Review and Update The City received a Small Cities Allotment Grant from ODOT. The plan is to pave North Saginaw from Roe Davis and hopefully as far as Jamison. With the \$100K from the grant and money from the fuel tax and other revenues we have budgeted this year around \$300K for street paving. Anderson Perry will do the engineering packet and the bid packet. The design engineering packet from Anderson Perry will be \$15K. Administrator Letham projects that the cost estimates will be more than expected two years ago. Cost estimate is more than \$200K, this puts the City under stricter rules for bidding. Councilor Beers asked Brandon Mahon from Anderson Perry if the City is looking at \$30K just to Anderson Perry. Brandon responded that the design engineering will be \$15K, however, for the construction engineering, it is bid on an hourly basis, so will be \$15K or less. Councilor Brizendine made a motion to approve Anderson Perry Work Order #2022-4 as presented. Councilor Beers seconded the motion. Councilors Beers and Brizendine voted aye. Councilors Allison and Shepherd voted nay. Councilor Quick asked Councilors Allison and Shepherd, why they voted nay. Councilor Shepherd felt that \$15K was a lot of money without a quote from someone else. Administrator Letham explained that Anderson Perry is the Engineer of Record for the City. He asked Anderson Perry to prepare the quote for the Design Engineering and Construction Engineering tasks. Councilor Allison asked if we have asked any other engineering firms for quotes. Councilor Shepherd expressed her opinion that \$15K was a lot of money to not have competitive quotes. Councilor Allison said she knows of some paving companies that have their own engineers. Councilor Quick asked what would be the downside of looking at another engineering firm. Administrator Letham said time. A new firm would have to come in and get to know the project. Councilor Beers said look at the timeframe. We are already in July, if we go with another agency to write this, we may miss our window and the \$100K would be gone. Councilor Quick asked if Brandon Mahon could explain what goes into the engineering that costs so much. Mr. Mahon explained that they would bring in surveyors to survey the project. It is the development of the design. Engineers would create the engineering design and contract documents. The City would have a bid package to be able to go out to bid. The specifications define what type of pavement, all the controls to

help the contractor understand what the scope of the work is. Make sure we have the correct compaction. That is design effort. The construction effort is if the contractor has questions or if observation is needed Anderson Perry would be available. Industry standard for larger municipal projects is 10% of construction for design and 10% of construction for construction engineering. Mr. Mahon said they did what they could to trim out any excess in the project and he told Administrator Letham that if the cost is a concern, they can see about cutting out some of the scope, however, he isn't sure what they could take out and still leave the City with a fully biddable package. Councilor Quick voted aye. Ayes -3, Nay -2, motion carried. Councilor Allison asked what the distance is planned for the paving project. She said paving companies can tell you how much it costs per foot.

- Tom Choate Said he believes there is no need for an engineer. He commented that the costs from Anderson Perry are too high. He said that the City of Bend does not use an engineer to engineer each paving job. He said that he and Councilor Allison know that you don't need engineering on every job You can put together a specification and a company can give you a bid from that. He said he understands that Anderson Perry has done a lot for the City and knows the City very well but thinks the City should look at getting competitive bids for engineering services. Councilor Allison asked Mr. Choate if he is saying N. Saginaw has already been engineered. Mr. Choate said it doesn't need to be engineered if you just do an overlay. The street can be put to a specified width and depth. If there is an issue it would be the engineer's fault, not the contractor. Once the engineer signs off on a job it is no longer the responsibility of the contractor. Councilor Shepherd expressed concern over water in that area. She asked if the City was going to pave over the street or is the City looking at making it a better road. Administrator Letham explained that a couple of years ago when the City first started looking at this project there was a thought to thoroughly replace the base. That option is very expensive. He explained that if we tried to do that now, he doesn't know if the City could afford that. Councilor Brizendine clarified that the City is looking at an a grind & replace instead of replacing the entire base and asphalt. Councilor Shepherd asked about the water that flows down King. Administrator Letham acknowledged that King does have a flooding issue. He has a grant application in for a flood study to mitigate that floodway area.
- Brandon Mahon Mr. Mahon asked if he could speak regarding previous comments. Anderson Perry's fee estimates are in no way gouging the City. They are not "fluffing" up cost estimates thinking they are the only ones available. He hopes that the City and Anderson Perry have a good enough relationship to understand that is not how Anderson Perry operates or does business. He said on the last couple of road jobs Anderson Perry has lost money because they try to do them as cheaply as they can. Cities such as Baker City has design standards, etc. that they can utilize for some of their efforts. Hines does not have that. Anderson Perry's efforts are to control the quality of the work, and to say, here's the scope, here's the boundaries to perform inside, here's the quality control aspects we're putting in place, to make sure to the best of our ability that it does get constructed appropriately, has the appropriate compaction, etc. Those elements go into that design effort. Councilor Brizendine asked if there would be someone here from Anderson Perry to oversee the project. Mr. Mahon said yes, that is the intent of the Construction Engineering. Councilor Beers addressed Mr. Choate's comment about the park bathroom engineering quote from Anderson Perry that came in at \$20K and the secondary quote that came in at \$4K. He asked if the park bathroom was completed yet. Mr. Choate commented that the problem with the bathroom was that it wasn't put out to bid. Mr. Mahon agreed that the quote from the other company had come in less, and he knows that other company and had recommended that company to the City Council at that meeting.
- i. Park Bathroom: Project Review and Update Bid package will be ready this week for release. The plans are in the Council packets. Planned timeline is the bid package will be released at the end of July. Construction should begin by the end of August with completion before the end of October.
- h. Wastewater System Improvement South Saginaw Line Extension Quotes This project has to do with the new home being built on S. Saginaw. The City needed to extend the sewer line approximately 200'. The design needed to be run through DEQ. The City received approval from DEQ on June 27th. Solicitation

for Quote was then released on our website June 27th. On the 27th Administrator Letham also tried to get it in the paper for June 29th, but understandably the paper was full. He reached out to three different contractors, having staff email quote requests directly to these contractors, Palmer Excavation, Choate Construction and Warrington Construction. The City received one quote back which is included in the Council packet. **Tom Choate** asked if he could address the Council. He mentioned that when they received the quote, the turnaround time was insufficient. *Councilor Shepard* asked if the sewer line needed to be in place before the house could be sold. *Administrator Letham* explained that there was a timeline in place to try to get the home completed by the end of July. At this time, the contractor has had a supply issue which has pushed him back two weeks. So, at this point the Council can choose A) Go with the one quote that was received B) Ask everyone for a new quote and set a new timeframe. **Councilor Shepher**d asked if the money being quoted is part of the donation by the City and Administrator Letham said no. **Tom Choate** – asked how much the house will have to sell for to recoup the money everyone has put in. **Administrator Letham** responded that the contractor's cost was \$278K and with other costs the house needs to sell for around \$310K - \$320K. *The Council requested that Administrator Letham request a resubmission of quotes*.

- j. Resolution 2328: Extending Worker's Compensation to Volunteers A resolution extending worker's compensation coverage to volunteers for the City of Hines. Administrator Letham read the resolution in its entirety. Councilor Allison made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2328. Councilor Brizendine seconded the motion. All ayes, motion carried.
- k. Measure 109 (ORS-475) Discussion In November 2020, Ballot Measure 109, the Oregon Psilocybin Services Act was passed. It created a license and regulatory framework for production of psilocybin and facilitation of psilocybin services for adults 21 and older and created the Oregon Psilocybin Advisory Board that makes recommendations to OHA. By default, all cities and counties are "opted in" to permitting psilocybin services. Cities and counties that desire to prohibit the establishment of psilocybin-related businesses may do so by referral as early as the November 8, 2022 election. If a city or county chooses not to refer the "opt-out" option to voters this November, it will not have another opportunity to do so until the next statewide general election in 2024. If voters elect to prohibit psilocybin services this November, the governing body must provide the text of the prohibiting ordinance to OHA. Councilor Brizendine asked if the City opted out, could someone make a purchase out of the area and bring it back and consume it here. Administrator Letham said no. It must be consumed in a licensed facility. Chief DeLange - if the City doesn't opt-out and a licensed manufacturing facility is opened and there is a break-in, suddenly you have psilocybin in the community. Councilor Beers asked how long the chemical stays in the body. Chief DeLange stated that it depends on different factors. Councilor Brizendine said this is the City trying to protect the citizens of Hines. Tom Choate - Making something illegal does not stop people from using. Medically there is probably benefits to a mushroom as there is cannabis. Education is needed. Chief DeLange agreed with Mr. Choate but said that as a governing body the City needs to do what it can. Councilor Shepherd said that as small as we are, we do not have the treatment facilities that are in places like Portland. Councilor Beers said its doubtful we could get the trained staff for this. Councilor Brizendine said it could allow for someone to grow here and there could be break-ins. Administrator Letham advised there are two options. There is a permanent ban or a two-year moratorium. To clarify, at this time, Measure 109 has passed and by default the whole state is "opted in" to the program. Cities and counties have the option to refer the measure to citizen vote for a permanent ban, or wait two years and vote in 2024, or do nothing. If the Council wants to opt-out, it either goes on the November 2022 ballot for the residents to decide now, or the City could opt for a moratorium and then put it on the ballot in 2024. Doing nothing automatically allows the program to start in Hines. The City of Burns has it on their agenda for the July 13th meeting. For placement on the November 2022 ballot, documentation must be received by the local election official by August 19, 2022. Councilor Beers commented that means the paperwork needs to be ready for Council's vote by the next meeting to meet the tight timeline. Administrator Letham said it would probably be cutting it close but could possibly wait until the August 9th meeting. Councilors Beers and Brizendine both requested Administrator Letham get it on the agenda for the July 26th meeting.

### VIII. PUBLIC COMMENT: (Speaking Time May Be Limited)

Tom Choate - Told Councilor Quick that he thinks she did a fine job running the meeting.

## IX. Mayor and Council Comments

Councilor Allison - The parks look amazing. Thanks to Chief DeLange for staying late.

**Councilor Beers** – Thanks Kirby and Public Works, and all the department heads. Special thanks to Kirby and Jerry for getting the sewage issue taken care of.

**Councilor Brizendine** – Thanks Kirby for everything you do for us, and to Ryan especially. Glad to hear the new position is open. As Council, I think we need to do research on Measure 109.

Councilor Shepherd – I have a close friend that has gone through the psilocybin treatment, and it can work, but I don't know if it's for everyone. Pettibone road patch needs to be done where they dug for the water project. Councilor Allison - She said that when the contractors finished with E. Hanley, they did a good job of patching the street.

**Councilor Quick** – She noticed that the grass had started to die at the north park when they put in the sprinklers. Administrator Letham said the grass will come back now that the water is back on.

Administrator Letham – He wanted to publicly thank, on the record, Jerry Lewellen for his service. He took care of the sewer issue that Councilor Beers called in. He goes above and beyond and is a great guy to work with. Chief DeLange spoke up and said he seconds that. Jerry does a lot for the police.

Next Council meeting is scheduled for July 26, 2022, at 6:30pm.

# a. Review Quotes for South Saginaw Sewer Line Extension

Harney Homes is building a home at 244 S. Saginaw. The City intends to extend the sewer line to service two more lots. Water services have already been installed. The City applied to DEQ to extend sewer services to these two lots. DEQ reviewed and approved the extension on June 27th. June 27th the City released a request for quotes for this work. The City received one quote. The City Council voted to resubmit the request for quote with the deadline set for 4pm today (June18, 2022). The City received three quotes.

- Choate Construction Quote total was \$35,950
- Warrington Construction Quote total was \$45,987
- Palmer Excavation Quote total was \$33,200

None of the quotes gave a lead time. However, Administrator Letham asked each of them, and notated in handwriting on the individual quotes that each of them affirmed they would have the project complete by the contract lead time of August 7, 2022.

b. Council Discussion and Decision to Award the South Saginaw Project – Councilor Quick asked if the quotes were itemized. Administrator Letham confirmed that two of the three were itemized, Palmer Excavation and Choate Construction. Councilor Quick asked if the contractors would need to sign that they agree to the deadline. Administrator Letham explained that once the Council selects the contractor, he will draft up a contract which will state the expectations of the City, and the selected contractor will sign the contract. The Mayor expressed concern about the work not being done on time. Councilor Beers confirmed with Administrator Letham that the contractors are all licensed and bonded. Councilor Quick asked if the City has worked with Palmer Excavation in the past. Administrator Letham said yes. Councilor Beers commented that Palmer Excavation gave the most detailed quote. Councilor Allison asked what the line on Choate Construction's quote for Testing means. Administrator Letham explained that once the line is installed and connected to the City's line there will be testing to make sure there are no leaks. Councilor

Beers made a motion to accept the quote from Palmer Excavation. Councilor Allison seconded the motion. 4-Ayes, 1- Abstained (Councilor Shepherd), motion carried.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HINES OREGON, TEMPORARILY SUSPENDING THE FEES CHARGED TO PROPERTY OWNERS DESIRING TO CONNECT TO CITY WATER AND SEWER SERVICES

**FINDINGS:** In recent years, development and construction of new residential homes has been slow or non-existent. This has created a shortage of housing in the City. It has been determined that permitting and construction costs, including fees charged by the City, are prohibitive to new development and construction.

WHEREAS, the City, through its governing body, desires to stimulate development and construction of new residential housing; and

WHEREAS, the City, currently charges \$800 plus materials to connect to the City water system, and \$600 plus materials to connect to the City sewer system; and

WHEREAS, the City sees the elimination of connection fees for water and sewer for new residential development and construction, known as System Development Charges, as a way of promoting new housing construction;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HINES, OREGON:

That effective October 1, 2020, System Development Charges for any new development and construction for residential use in a property zoned Single Family Residential, Multi-Family Residential are suspended until September 30, 2021.

Also.

- 1. The City of Hines may review suspension of said fees at any time.
- 2. The City, through its governing body, may choose to extend the suspension of System Development Charges by resolution.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The following is instruction from our City Attorney, Brian DiFonzo:

"Because there are two (2) options on the table with respect to the ban, ...(1) a permanent ban (until revoked) and (2) a temporary (2 year ban), we will provide both resolutions and draft ordinances for review and discussion at the meeting. Of course, the council would elect one or the other, but both will be consistent with those being presented to the City of Burns....Keep in mind that the two-year ban is intended to delay implementation of psylocibin facilities and use in the City while reasonable time, place and manner restrictions can be put in place before activities commence. It is not clear at this point whether a permanent ban would be permitted at the end of the two-year ban period. This is something the council will want to be aware of when considering the option of the two year or permanent ban."

# **2021 Public Listening Sessions**

# Q: When will rules be adopted for Oregon Psilocybin Services?

A: OHA will complete two rulemaking sessions in 2022. The first round of rulemaking in February will focus on training programs and products/testing, with rules likely to be adopted by the end of May 2022. The second round of rulemaking in the fall will focus on the remainder of program rules. The final rules will be adopted by December 31, 2022 in time for OHA to begin receiving applications for licensure on January 2, 2023.

# Q: Will one person be able to hold multiple license types?

A: Individuals may hold multiple licenses if they meet the eligibility requirements to apply for licensure and receive approval for licensure. An individual may not hold an interest in more than one manufacturer license or more than five service center licenses.

# Q: Have there been conversations about creating equitable opportunities for minority business owners to ensure access within the market as the program is built?

A: Yes, equitable opportunities for minority business owners have been, and continue to be, discussed. OHA is working to better understand ways to address equity issues within the statutory authorities granted by M109 and within administrative rules. Although OHA is unable to prioritize licensees based on race, OHA is exploring social equity considerations for licensees.

# Q: Are there any efforts to address conflicts of interest and moderate current committee members' ability to have advanced notice of details before they are made public?

A: All committee members are public officials and are responsible for complying with Oregon Government Ethics Law. All advisory board meetings and subcommittee meetings are accessible to the public. Meeting notes and recordings are also available online at: Oregon Psilocybin Advisory Board.

# Q: Is the state planning to allocate any funding to support clinical research to improve the therapy and the use of psychedelic substances as a whole?

A: No. Under M109, the funds received from application and licensure fees must cover the costs of Oregon Psilocybin Services operations. There are no additional funding sources to support additional work at this time.

# Q: If rules are counter-productive to a functioning system, how quickly can rule changes be made and what is the process for license holders to submit requests for rule changes?

A: The administrative rule making process requires approximately six months from start to finish for each set of rules being adopted. In the case of an emergency, the agency may choose to use a temporary rule making process that is much quicker. OHA will continually evaluate rules for efficacy.

# **Products & Testing**

# Q: What are the land use requirements for manufacturing/production?

A: M109 requires that the property owner give permission for psilocybin production. Other land use requirements may be established by local governments. Applicants will be required to produce a Land Use Compatibility Statement (LUCS) which demonstrates that the proposed use of the property is consistent with local zoning code.

# Q: What are the final forms that psilocybin can take, in terms of products?

A: We will adopt administrative rules that specify which product forms will be permitted. These rules will be effective in May 2022.

## Q: What will the laboratories be required to test for?

A: This will be addressed in May rules, although additional rulemaking may occur later in 2022.

### Q: Will there be security requirements for manufacturers and service centers?

A: Yes. Exact requirements will be established in rule.

### Q: Can people grow and use mushrooms for their own personal use?

A: M109 does not allow for personal use. M109 creates a regulatory framework for the production of psilocybin and the provision of psilocybin services.

# Service Centers

# Q: What are the land use requirements for a service center?

A: M109 requires that a service center be at least 1000 ft. from a school and have defined boundaries. Other land use requirements may be established by local governments. Applicants will be required to produce a Land Use Compatibility Statement (LUCS) which demonstrates that the proposed use of the property is consistent with local zoning code.

### Q: What is considered the boundaries of the center?

A: Boundaries and other premises requirements for licensed service centers will be considered during rulemaking later in 2022.

# Q: What will the criteria be for the Center? interior design, furniture, music system, lighting, bathrooms, etc.

A: Premises requirements for licensed service centers will be considered during rulemaking later in 2022. Generally, these rules will focus on requirements that affect public health and safety rather than items such as lighting and design.

#### Q: Can centers have access to the outdoors?

A: The board has recommended that service centers have access to the outdoors. Under M109, licensed service centers must have defined boundaries and cannot be located on public land. Specific requirements for service centers premises will be considered during rulemaking later in 2022.

# Q: Will there be different categories of service centers?

A: No.

# Q: Can the service centers operate ancillary or peripheral services that could offer additional revenue streams and help with financial viability?

A: These requirements will be considered during rulemaking in 2022.

# **Administration Session**

# Q: Will clients need a medical referral to receive psilocybin services in a service center?

A: No. M109 specifically states that a client will not be required to be diagnosed with a medical condition to receive psilocybin services. Clients must be 21 years of age or older to access psilocybin services.

# Q: What is the process by which the client gets the medicine for treatment?

A: A client may purchase psilocybin products from a licensed service center for consumption during a facilitated administrative session at that service center. Licensed facilitators will not provide psilocybin products to clients.

# Q: How will dosage be recommended? Will clients have a chance to voice their preference for dosage?

A: Rules specifying dosage requirements will be adopted later in 2022. Clients will have an opportunity to discuss all aspects of their administrative session, including dosage, during their preparation session with a licensed facilitator. Maximum doses may be established in rule. Clients and licensed facilitators will work together to determine dosage. These details will be established in rule.

Q: If someone is participating in multiple administration sessions within a small window of time is a separate prep session required for each administration session? A: Yes. M109 requires a preparation session to precede each administration session.

# Q: Could the client choose to participate in multiple prep sessions before the administration session? What about multiple integration sessions after the administration session?

A: Details on the preparation, administration, and integration sessions will be established in rule later this year.

## Q: Is the board considering micro-dosing sessions?

A: The term "microdose" is not used in M109. M109 requires OHA to establish the maximum concentration of psilocybin that is permitted in a single serving of a psilocybin

product, and the number of servings that are permitted in a psilocybin product package. Details will be established in rule later this year.

# Q: Will there be a standardized screening tool for harm reduction purposes?

A: M109 requires a preparation session for clients with a licensed facilitator. A client intake form is required for this process and will include documentation of risk factors and contraindications, as well as considerations for health and safety. Details will be considered during the rulemaking process.

# Q: Will sessions be able to be subsidized for those who cannot afford a session?

A: M109 does not allow OHA to use funds in this manner. Funds from application and licensure fees must cover the costs for Oregon Psilocybin Services. OHA does not have statutory authority to regulate costs of psilocybin services. Private organizations or licensed service centers and facilitators may choose to offer subsidies for lower income clients.

## Q: Will groups be allowed? How large?

A: The board has recommended that group sessions be permitted. The exact requirements for group sessions will be detailed in administrative rules to be adopted later in 2022.

#### Q: How much will services cost?

A: Under M109, OHA cannot control the costs for training or services. The program will set application and license fees in rule and there will be a 15% sales tax on sale of psilocybin products to clients for administration sessions. Licensees and training programs will determine the cost of their services.

# Training Programs

## Q: What are the general requirements of a facilitator training program?

A: Training program curriculum must be approved by OHA. Application requirements for training program approval will be established in May rules.

## Q: What are the requirements of the trainers themselves?

A: The requirements will be specified in May rules.

## Q: When can the facilitator training programs start?

A: OHA estimates that staffing and systems will be in place to approve training programs in June of 2022. OHA will not be able to offer retroactive approval for programs operating before that time.

### Q: There are already a lot of training programs out there... what is transferrable?

A: The board has recommended that some transfer of credits be allowed. Rules on transfer of credits will be discussed in the May rulemaking.

# Q: How does OHA plan to acknowledge traditional and indigenous healers within the training requirements?

A: Experience in traditional healing may be considered as transferrable credits depending on what is established in May Rules.

# Q: Will the training for facilitators include significant material on how to deal with mental health issues or issues related to trauma that arise during session?

A: The board has made recommendations on training curriculum, including traumainformed care, and OHA will be considering these recommendations during May rulemaking.

#### Q: How much will a training program cost?

A: Under M109, OHA cannot control the costs for training programs or psilocybin services. The program will set application and license fees in rule, and there will be a 15% sales tax on sale of psilocybin products to clients for administration sessions. Licensees and training programs will determine the cost of their services.

# Facilitation

during May rulemaking.

Q: Is there somewhere I can find information about qualifications (certification, degree, experience, etc.) for preparing to work as a Psilocybin Services Facilitator?

A: Every facilitator must complete a training program that is approved by OHA as a condition of being licensed. A high school diploma, or its equivalent, will be required without additional degrees or certifications. Additional qualifications will be discussed

Q: Does a facilitator have to have a medical license?

A: No.

Q: Will a facilitator be required to have participated themselves in a psilocybin administration session?

A: No.

Q: Will there be standardized safety protocols that facilitators will be required to follow?

A: Yes. Exact requirements will be established in rule.

Q: Are 2 licenses required for a facilitator delivering this service; one for providing psilocybin products and another for the service itself?

A: Psilocybin products are provided to clients by a licensed service center for administration sessions that take place at their location. M109 allows a person to hold both a service center and facilitator license, if that is what the licensee chooses to apply for.

Q: Will the same license apply to both solo and group sessions? Will there be different types of facilitator licenses?

A: The board has recommended that there only be one type of facilitator license. OHA will consider this recommendation before adopting May Rules.

Q: Can the psilocybin services be offered within a ceremonial or religious context? A: Yes, if psilocybin services take place at a licensed service center and is otherwise compliant with statute and rule requirements.

Q: How will OHA ensure that those who hold traditional knowledge or have experience with natural healing practices are recognized and have equitable access to licensing?

A: The board has made recommendations on training curriculum, including history of Indigenous practices, and OHA will be considering these recommendations during May rule making. Experience with traditional healing may be eligible for credit in a training program.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING REFERRAL TO THE ELECTORS OF CITY OF HINES THE QUESTION OF PROHIBITING PSILOCYBIN-RELATED BUSINESSES IN THE CITY, INCLUDING PSILOCYBIN PRODUCT MANUFACTURERS AND SERVICE CENTER OPERATORS.

WHEREAS, in November 2020, Oregon voters approved Ballot Measure 109, known as the Oregon Psilocybin Service Act (codified at ORS 475A), which allows for the manufacture, delivery, and administration of psilocybin at licensed facilities; and

WHEREAS, ORS 475A.235 provides that the Oregon Heath Authority ("OHA") will regulate the manufacture, transportation, delivery, sale, and purchase of psilocybin products and the provision of psilocybin services in the state; and

WHEREAS, OHA will begin accepting applications for licensure to manufacture, deliver, and administer psilocybin on January 2, 2023; and

WHEREAS, OHA has initiated a rulemaking process to implement the state's psilocybin regulatory program. As of July <u>46</u>, 2022, OHA has not completed the rulemaking process. Oregon counties and cities are uncertain how the manufacture, delivery, and administration of psilocybin at licensed psilocybin facilities will operate within local jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, ORS 475A.718 provides that a city council may adopt an ordinance to be referred to the electors of the city prohibiting the establishment of state licensed psilocybin product manufacturers and/or psilocybin service centers in the area subject to the city's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the city council (the "Council") for City of Hines ("City") adopted Ordinance No. 332, which ordinance prohibits state-licensed psilocybin manufacturers and psilocybin-related businesses in City's jurisdictional boundaries to be referred to the voters at the next statewide general election held on November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to refer the question of whether to prohibit (i.e., ban) state-licensed psilocybin manufacturers and psilocybin-related businesses to the voters of City at the next statewide general election held on November 8, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Hines resolves as follows:

- 1. <u>Findings.</u> The above-stated findings contained in this Resolution No. <u>339</u> (this "Resolution") are hereby adopted.
- 2. <u>Prohibition.</u> The Council refers to City's voters Ordinance No. <u>332</u> which ordinance concerns a prohibition on state-licensed psilocybin manufacturers and psilocybin-related businesses in City's jurisdictional boundaries.
- 3. <u>General Election Conducted by Mail</u>. The general election will be held on November 8, 2022. # Exhibit A Ballot Title

CAPTION: Prohibits psilocybin-related businesses within City of Hines.

QUESTION: Shall City of Hines prohibit psilocybin-related businesses in the city?

SUMMARY: Psilocybin is the psychedelic drug found in certain mushrooms. State law allows

operation and/or manufacture of certain licensed psilocybin services. State law provides that a city council may adopt an ordinance to be referred to the voters to prohibit (i.e., ban) the establishment and/or operation of psilocybin-related registered or licensed activities. City of Hines has adopted an ordinance to prohibit psilocybin-related businesses in the city, subject to voter approval. Approval of this measure would prohibit the establishment and/or operation of psilocybin manufacturers and/or service centers within any area subject to the city's jurisdiction. The proposed ordinance is available for public inspection on

the city's website and at City Hall.

## Exhibit B Explanatory Statement

Approval of this measure would prohibit (i.e., ban) the establishment and operation of psilocybin-related businesses in City of Hines.

Ballot Measure 109 was passed by Oregon voters in November 2020 directing the Oregon Health Authority ("OHA") to license and regulate the manufacture, transportation, delivery, sale, and purchase of psilocybin products. Psilocybin is the psychedelic drug derived from certain mushrooms.

ORS 475A.235 provides, in pertinent part, that OHA will regulate the manufacture, transportation, delivery, sale, and purchase of psilocybin products and the provision of psilocybin services in the State of Oregon. OHA has initiated the rulemaking process to implement the state's regulatory program. However, because the rulemaking process has not been completed to date, the city is uncertain how the manufacture, delivery, and administration of psilocybin at licensed psilocybin facilities will function or operate.

ORS Chapter 475A.718 provides a city council may adopt an ordinance prohibiting the establishment and operation of psilocybin-related businesses within the city, but the city council must refer the ordinance to the voters at a statewide general election. The city has adopted Ordinance No. 329, the Psilocybin Prohibition Ordinance, prohibiting the establishment and/or operation of psilocybin-related businesses within the city's jurisdictional boundaries. Ordinance No. 339 will take effect and become operative 30 days after voter approval (if applicable).

If approved, this measure will prohibit psilocybin-related businesses within the city.

# ORDINANCE NO. 332

AN ORDINANCE OF CITY OF HINES DECLARING A BAN ON PSILOCYBIN-RELATED BUSINESSES IN THE CITY, INCLUDING PSILOCYBIN PRODUCT MANUFACTURERS AND SERVICE CENTER OPERATORS.

WHEREAS, OHA has initiated a rulemaking process to implement the state's psilocybin regulatory program. As of July <u>26</u>, 2022, OHA has not completed the rulemaking process. Oregon counties and cities are uncertain how the manufacture, delivery, and administration of psilocybin at licensed psilocybin facilities will operate within local jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, ORS 475A.718 provides that a city council may adopt an ordinance to be referred to the electors of the city prohibiting the establishment of state licensed psilocybin product manufacturers and/or psilocybin service centers in the area subject to the city's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the city council (the "Council") for City of Hines ("City") adopted Ordinance No. 332, which ordinance prohibits state-licensed psilocybin manufacturers and psilocybin-related businesses in City's jurisdictional boundaries to be referred to the voters at the next statewide general election held on November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to refer the question of whether to prohibit (i.e., ban) state-licensed psilocybin manufacturers and psilocybin-related businesses to the voters of City at the next statewide general election held on November 8, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Hines ordains as follows:

- 1. Findings. The above-stated findings are hereby adopted.
- 2. <u>Short Title</u>. This Ordinance No. <u>332</u> (this "Ordinance") may be referred to as the "Psilocybin Prohibition Ordinance."
- 3. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Ordinance is to prohibit (i.e., ban) the operation and/or establishment of psilocybin-related businesses within City, subject to voter approval.

- 4. <u>Prohibition</u>. Subject to voter approval, City hereby prohibits the establishment and/or operation of the following in any area subject to City's jurisdiction: (a) psilocybin product manufacturers licensed under ORS 275A.290; (b) psilocybin service center operators licensed under ORS 275A.305; and/or (c) any combination of the entities described in this Section 4.
- 5. <u>Notice to OHA</u>. City's city manager (or his or her designee) will notify OHA of City's adoption of this Ordinance and provide the text of this Ordinance to OHA in a form and manner prescribed by OHA.
- 6. <u>Referral</u>. This Ordinance will be referred by council resolution to City's electors at the next statewide general election held on November 8, 2022.
- 7. Interpretation; Severability; Errors. This Ordinance supersedes all City ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies in conflict with this Ordinance (but only to the extent in conflict with this Ordinance). All pronouns contained in this Ordinance and any variations thereof will be deemed to refer to the masculine, feminine, or neutral, singular or plural, as the identity of the parties may require. The singular includes the plural and the plural includes the singular. The word "or" is not exclusive. The words "include," "includes," and "including" are not limiting. Any reference to a particular law, rule, regulation, code, and/or ordinance includes the law, rule, regulation, code, and/or ordinance as now in force and which may hereafter be amended. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared severable. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, and/or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid, unenforceable, and/or unconstitutional, such invalid, unenforceable, and/or unconstitutional section, subsection, sentence, clause, and/or portion will (a) yield to a construction permitting enforcement to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law, and (b) not affect the validity, enforceability, and/or constitutionality of the remaining portion of this Ordinance. This Ordinance may be corrected by order of the Council to cure editorial and/or clerical errors.
- 8. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance will be effective for all purposes 30 days after the date on which it is approved by City's voters.

# Exhibit A Ballot Title

CAPTION: Prohibits psilocybin-related businesses within City of Hines for two years.

QUESTION: Shall City of Hines prohibit psilocybin-related businesses in the city for two

years?

SUMMARY: Psilocybin is the psychedelic drug found in certain mushrooms. State law allows

operation and/or manufacture of certain licensed psilocybin services. State law provides that a city council may adopt an ordinance to be referred to the voters to prohibit (i.e., ban) the establishment and/or operation of psilocybin-related registered or licensed activities. City of Hines has adopted an ordinance to prohibit psilocybin-related businesses in the city for two years commencing on January 1, 2023, subject to voter approval. Approval of this measure would prohibit the establishment and/or operation of psilocybin manufacturers and/or service centers within any area subject to the city's jurisdiction until December 31, 2024. The proposed ordinance is available for public inspection on the city's

website and at City Hall.

## Exhibit B Explanatory Statement

Approval of this measure would prohibit (i.e., ban) the establishment and operation of psilocybin-related businesses in City of Hines for a period of two years commencing on January 1, 2023.

Ballot Measure 109 was passed by Oregon voters in November 2020 directing the Oregon Health Authority ("OHA") to license and regulate the manufacture, transportation, delivery, sale, and purchase of psilocybin products. Psilocybin is the psychedelic drug derived from certain mushrooms.

ORS 475A.235 provides, in pertinent part, that OHA will regulate the manufacture, transportation, delivery, sale, and purchase of psilocybin products and provision of psilocybin services in the State of Oregon. OHA has initiated the rulemaking process to implement the state's regulatory program. However, because the rulemaking process has not been completed to date, the city is uncertain how the manufacture, delivery, and administration of psilocybin at licensed psilocybin facilities will function or operate.

The city finds that temporarily prohibiting psilocybin product manufacturers and service centers in the city's jurisdictional boundaries will provide sufficient time for the state's psilocybin licensing and regulatory program to be implemented. The temporary ban will also afford the city time to consider reasonable time, place, and manner regulations concerning the operation of psilocybin facilities which are in best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the city's residents.

ORS Chapter 475A.718 provides a city council may adopt an ordinance prohibiting the establishment and operation of psilocybin-related businesses within the city, but the city council must refer the ordinance to the voters at a statewide general election. The city has adopted Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_, the Psilocybin Temporary Prohibition Ordinance, prohibiting the establishment and/or operation of psilocybin-related businesses within the city's jurisdictional boundaries commencing on January 1, 2023. Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_ will take effect and become operative 30 days after voter approval (if applicable).

If approved, this measure will prohibit psilocybin-related businesses within the city until December 31, 2024.

AN ORDINANCE OF CITY OF HINES DECLARING A TEMPORARY BAN ON PSILOCYBIN-RELATED BUSINESSES IN THE CITY, INCLUDING PSILOCYBIN PRODUCT MANUFACTURERS AND SERVICE CENTER OPERATORS.

WHEREAS, in November 2020, Oregon voters approved Ballot Measure 109, known as the Oregon Psilocybin Service Act (codified at ORS 475A), which allows for the manufacture, delivery, and administration of psilocybin at licensed facilities; and

WHEREAS, ORS 457A.235 provides that the Oregon Heath Authority ("OHA") will regulate the manufacture, transportation, delivery, sale, and purchase of psilocybin products and provision of psilocybin services in the state; and

WHEREAS, OHA will begin accepting applications for licensure to manufacture, deliver, and administer psilocybin on January 2, 2023; and

WHEREAS, OHA has initiated a rulemaking process to implement the state's psilocybin regulatory program. As of July \_\_\_\_\_, 2022, OHA has not completed the rulemaking process. Oregon counties and cities are uncertain how the manufacture, delivery, and administration of psilocybin at licensed psilocybin facilities will operate within local jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, ORS 475A.718 provides that a city council may adopt an ordinance to be referred to the electors of the city prohibiting the establishment of state licensed psilocybin product manufacturers and/or psilocybin service centers in the area subject to the city's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the city council (the "Council") for City of Hines ("City") finds that temporarily prohibiting psilocybin product manufacturers and service centers in City's jurisdictional boundaries to (a) enable adoption of the state's psilocybin licensing and regulatory program, and (b) allow City time to consider reasonable time, place, and manner regulations concerning the operation of psilocybin facilities is in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of City residents; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to refer the question of whether to establish a two-year prohibition (i.e., ban) on state-licensed psilocybin manufacturers and psilocybin-related businesses to the voters of City at the next statewide general election held on November 8, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Hines ordains as follows:

- 1. Findings. The above-stated findings are hereby adopted.
- 2. <u>Short Title</u>. This Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_ (this "Ordinance") may be referred to as the "Psilocybin Temporary Prohibition Ordinance."

- 3. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Ordinance is to (a) temporarily prohibit (i.e., ban) operation and/or establishment of psilocybin-related businesses within City's incorporated limits for a period of two years, subject to voter approval, (b) enable adoption of the state's psilocybin licensing and regulatory program, and (c) allow City time to consider reasonable time, place, and manner regulations concerning the operation of psilocybin facilities to protect the health, safety, and welfare of City residents.
- 4. <u>Prohibition</u>. Subject to voter approval, City hereby prohibits the establishment and/or operation of the following in any area subject to City's jurisdiction: (a) psilocybin product manufacturers licensed under ORS 275A.290; (b) psilocybin service center operators licensed under ORS 275A.305; and/or (c) any combination of the entities described in this Section 4.
- 5. <u>Sunset Clause</u>. This Ordinance is repealed with no further force and effect at 11:59 p.m. on December 31, 2024.
- 6. <u>Notice to OHA</u>. City's city manager (or his or her designee) will notify OHA of City's adoption of this Ordinance and provide the text of this Ordinance to OHA in a form and manner prescribed by OHA.
- 7. <u>Referral</u>. This Ordinance will be referred by council resolution to City's electors at the next statewide general election held on November 8, 2022.
- Interpretation; Severability; Errors. This Ordinance supersedes all City ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies in conflict with this Ordinance (but only to the extent in conflict with this Ordinance). All pronouns contained in this Ordinance and any variations thereof will be deemed to refer to the masculine, feminine, or neutral, singular or plural, as the identity of the parties may require. The singular includes the plural and the plural includes the singular. The word "or" is not exclusive. The words "include," "includes," and "including" are not limiting. Any reference to a particular law, rule, regulation, code, and/or ordinance includes the law, rule, regulation, code, and/or ordinance as now in force and which may hereafter be amended. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared severable. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, and/or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid. unenforceable, and/or unconstitutional, such invalid, unenforceable, and/or unconstitutional section, subsection, sentence, clause, and/or portion will (a) yield to a construction permitting enforcement to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law, and (b) not affect the validity, enforceability, and/or constitutionality of the remaining portion of this Ordinance. Ordinance may be corrected by order of the Council to cure editorial and/or clerical errors.
- 9. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance will be effective for all purposes 30 days after the date on which it is approved by City's voters.

Your property has been noted to have grass and brush that is too tall and overgrown.

City code states the following:

A. No owner or person in charge of real property shall allow noxious vegetation on the property, except in native areas. Noxious vegetation is declared a nuisance.

B. The owner or person in charge of real property shall abate noxious vegetation from the property, except in native areas. If weeds, grass, brush, or other noxious vegetation, except in native areas, are allowed to exceed <u>ten inches in height</u> after June 1st, the city may cut the vegetation or have it cut by a private contractor, if the owner or person in charge of the property fails to do so or requests the city to do so. The owner and the person in charge shall be jointly and severally liable for the cost of abatement as provided in this chapter. *Hines Municipal Code* 9.52.050

In 2021, the Oregon Legislature passed Senate Bill 762. This comprehensive legislation provided more than \$220 million to help Oregon modernize and improve wildfire preparedness through three key strategies: creating fire-adapted communities, developing safe and effective response, and increasing the resiliency of Oregon's landscapes.

As part of this legislation, the Department of Forestry was directed, in coordination with Oregon State University, to oversee the development of a comprehensive wildfire risk map, assign one of five wildfire risk classes to properties, and identify the wildland-urban interface. (OAR 629-044-1000 through 1041). Your property has been identified as being in the **High** risk class. Your property is in the wildland-urban interface.

Risk was determined through an analysis of multiple data sets. If you lease your property, please share the report with your tenants.

Your property is classified as high or extreme <u>and</u> is in the wildland-urban interface. You may be required to take actions to create defensible space around your home and adhere to changes to building code requirements. Both of these regulatory processes are still in development.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

First, City staff have been working on contacting property owners to mow tall brush and grass. A letter was mailed out to a large list of property owners who have tall brush and grass. Also, a printing of the City's code on mowing requirements will be published in the paper this week.

Second, many residents (if not all) have received a letter from the Department of Forestry. We have received many calls asking what this means. The letter explains to citizens that area has been determined to be a high-risk area for wildfire. The letter states that property owners who have been notified may be required to action to:

"create defensible space around your home and adhere to changes to building code requirements."

Residents have 60 days to make public comment and/or appeal the designation. A meeting is scheduled for Harney County Court to discuss this issue at 1:15 pm July 27<sup>th</sup> (tomorrow) at the County Courthouse.

# How can I find out what my risk classification is?

Property owners can find their risk classification on the <u>Oregon Wildfire Risk Explorer</u>. You can enter your address to view the risk classification on your property and download a homeowners report. A paper copy can be requested by emailing the Oregon Department of Forestry at <u>forestryinfo@odf.oregon.gov</u>.

# My home or business is in the wildland-urban interface and at high or extreme risk; what does this mean for me?

Homes and businesses within the wildland-urban interface <u>AND</u> at high or extreme risk based on the wildfire risk map may be subject to the Oregon Defensible Space Code. On properties where structures have been issued a certificate of occupancy, a defensible space code will apply to homes and businesses.

# My home or business is not in the wildland-urban interface and not at high or extreme risk; what does this mean?

Homes and businesses not in the wildland-urban interface <u>AND</u> at high or extreme risk, based on the wildfire risk map, are not subject to the Oregon Defensible Space Code. The Office of State Fire Marshal recommends that home and business owners at high or extreme risk but NOT in the wildland-urban interface follow defensible space best practices. Wildfire does not recognize map boundary lines.

# My home or business is at high or extreme risk but not in the wildland-urban interface; does the code apply to me? What should I do?

No. The Oregon Defensible Space Code only applies to homes and businesses in both the wildland-urban interface AND at high or extreme risk based on the wildfire risk map developed by Oregon State University and the Oregon Department of Forestry.

The Office of State Fire Marshal recommends that home and business owners at high or extreme risk but NOT in the wildland-urban interface follow defensible space best practices. Wildfire does not recognize map boundary lines.



# My home or business is in the wildland-urban interface but not at high or extreme risk; does the code apply to me? What should I do?

No. The Oregon Defensible Space Code only applies to homes and businesses in both the wildland-urban interface AND at high or extreme risk based on the wildfire risk map developed by Oregon State University and the Oregon Department of Forestry. To be better protected against wildfire, follow defensible space best practices.

The Office of State Fire Marshal recommends that home and business owners in the wildland-urban interface but NOT at high or extreme risk follow defensible space best practices. Wildfire does not recognize map boundary lines. To be better protected against wildfire, follow defensible space best practices.

# I disagree with the Wildfire Risk Map's assessment of my home/business; is there an appeals process?

The Oregon Department of Forestry manages the Oregon Wildfire Risk Map. Concerns regarding wildfire risk level or wildland-urban interface boundaries should follow the Oregon Department of Forestry's appeals process <u>found here</u>.

## What is the Oregon Defensible Space Code?

The Oregon Defensible Space Code is modeled after the 2021 International Wildland-Urban Interface Code. When adopted, the code will apply to areas identified in the wildland-urban interface AND at high or extreme risk of wildfire. These areas are determined by a map created by Oregon State University and the Oregon Department of Forestry.

# What is the purpose of the Oregon Defensible Space Code?

The purpose of the Oregon Defensible Space Code is to establish minimum requirements for protecting life and property. Standards in the code are intended to mitigate the risk to life, structures, and other values from wildfire.

# What are the processes to adopt the Oregon Defensible Space Code?

In creating the Oregon Defensible Space Code, the Office of State Fire Marshal went through the same process as the Oregon Fire Code adoption process. A committee of stakeholders was created to offer suggestions, ask questions, and help shape the code within the legislative framework. Public comment was also received during the code adoption process. <u>Public comments can be requested or submitted at any time.</u>

## Who was involved with the code development process?

A list of the Oregon Defensible Space Code Committee members, minutes, and meeting recordings can be found on our website at <a href="mailto:tinyurl.com/2udrjznv">tinyurl.com/2udrjznv</a>.

# Is public comment still being accepted as part of the code development process?

Yes, public comment is still being accepted as part of the code development process. Anyone wishing to submit a comment should send it to SB762@osp.oregon.gov.

# Who does the Oregon Defensible Space Code apply to?

The Oregon Defensible Space Code applies to homes and businesses identified on the wildfire risk map, developed by Oregon State University and the Oregon Department of Forestry, in both the wildland-urban interface <u>and</u> high or extreme risk.

# When will the Oregon Defensible Space Code take effect?

The code development process and the adoption must be complete by December 2022. When the code is complete, it will be reviewed by the Oregon Fire Code Advisory Board (OFCAB). The OFCAB will consider, review, and recommend the draft code to the State Fire Marshal for adoption. The code will take effect in 2023.

# -Can local governments adopt a more stringent defensible space code?

Yes. The Oregon Defensible Space Code establishes the minimum defensible space requirements across the state for wildfire risk reduction on lands identified on the wildfire risk map. Any local requirements that a local government adopts for defensible space must be defensible space standards selected from the framework set forth in the International Wildland-Urban Interface Code.

## Who will be enforcing the code?

The Oregon Defensible Space Code can be enforced by the Office of State Fire Marshal and those identified as assistants to the State Fire Marshal (ORS 476.060).

#### How will the code be enforced?

The Office of State Fire Marshal's philosophy is to prioritize education before enforcement. When the Office of State Fire Marshal begins inspections, the Office will follow the existing code enforcement practices.

# What is the process to determine if my home/business meets code requirements?

# HOW DOES DEFENSIBLE SPACE REALLY WORK?

Defensible space can make a significant difference during a wildfire. It can offer your home or business protection from embers that can travel several miles from the actual fire front and the fire itself.

Embers are the leading cause of home loss during a wildfire. They can travel up to three miles ahead of the large flame front.



Defensible space is the buffer you create between your home or business and the grass, trees, shrubs, or any wildland area that surrounds it. Items to consider are plants, landscape arrangement, and outdoor furniture. This gives embers or flames fewer options to latch onto and ignite. Studies show that well-maintained defensible space can give your home an increased chance of surviving a wildfire\*, even if firefighters cannot reach your home.

To start, look at your home to ensure combustible materials like dried pine needles and leaves are removed from gutters, eaves, and around your chimney. Limb trees several feet off the ground to help avoid fire from getting into the tree crowns. Keep patios clean of dry combustible materials during times of high fire danger. Remove flammable items like outdoor furniture cushions. Keep dry wood piles and construction debris 30 feet away from your home. Make sure bushes around your home are limbed and not touching the siding.



Creating a defensible space plan for your home and business does not mean creating a moonscape. These plans can include trees, bushes, and other plants, if they are limbed and trimmed properly. Fire-resistant plants can also be a great addition to your yard. These plants are high in moisture content and low in oils. Fire-resistant plants range from ground covers to trees that can bring a beautiful, healthy landscape without sacrificing safety. Trees don't have to be off-limits; be thoughtful about where they are planted in your yard and what is growing underneath them.

# PROTECT YOUR HOME FROM WILDFIRE

- Remove dead and combustible vegetation, mulch, and other materials, especially within the first several feet from the home. Replace with decorative rock or gravel.
- Remove leaves, pine needles, and other debris from the roof, gutters, and on and under the deck to help prevent embers from igniting the home.
- Cover exterior attic vents, soffit vents, and areas below decks and patios with 1/8" metal wire mesh to help prevent sparks from entering the home.
- **Replace** combustible plants, furniture, and cushions on decks with non-combustible types.
- **Enclose** eaves to help prevent ember entry. Remove any vegetation growing directly under your eaves.
- Inspect the roof and replace missing shingles or tiles, make sure the valleys are in good repair.
- **Keep** lawns mowed and all plants watered. Keep it "Lean and Green".
- 8 Move construction material, trash, and woodpiles at least 30 feet away from the home and other outbuildings.
- **Trim** trees and remove or trim brush/bushes and ground cover plants under trees or next to structures or decks.
- Chip, compost, or haul yard debris to a recycling center. Follow local fire regulations if burning yard debris.

The ORESTAR User's Manual: Statement of Organization and ORESTAR User's Manual: Transaction Filing explains how to file a statement of organization and campaign finance transactions electronically using ORESTAR.

## Who Must File a Candidate Committee?

#### Then If you Relax. No action is necessary because under Oregon Election Law you are → Serve as your own treasurer not required to establish a candidate committee if you meet all of the criteria. However, you must keep track of all contributions and Do not have an existing candidate committee expenditures because if you exceed the \$750 threshold you must establish a committee and open a dedicated bank account not later than Do not expect to spend or receive more than three business days after exceeding the threshold. NOTE: Any fee paid \$750 during the entire calendar year (including infor filing a candidate's statement for inclusion in the state voters' kind contributions and personal funds) pamphlet is not included for the purpose of calculating the \$750 threshold. Additionally, you must either file a Certificate of Limited Contributions and Expenditures (PC 7) or all transactions that have occurred in the calendar year. See information below to determine if you are eligible to file a Certificate. File a Statement of Organization and establish a dedicated bank account -→ Do not expect to receive a total of more than either by using ORESTAR or by submitting the paper form Statement of \$3,500 or spend a total of more than \$3,500 for Organization for Candidate Committee (SEL 220) the entire calendar year File a Certificate of Limited Contributions and Expenditures either by using ORESTAR or by submitting the paper form (PC 7) not later than seven days after first receiving a contribution or making an expenditure File a Statement of Organization and establish a dedicated bank account -→ Expect to spend or receive more than \$3,500 either by using ORESTAR or by submitting the paper form Statement of Organization for Candidate Committee (SEL 220) File campaign finance transactions using ORESTAR

## What starts the whole process?

The decision to run for a public office (even if the office is not known), accepting contributions and making expenditures, whether from personal funds, campaign funds, or another person's funds to support your candidacy.

## Once I become a candidate, then what?

You must register your committee with the Secretary of State not later than 3 business days of first receiving a contribution or making an expenditure if you are not exempt under the \$750 threshold law.

#### May I serve as my own treasurer?

Yes, you may serve as your own treasurer. The Campaign Finance Manual provides committees with information on candidate/treasurer responsibilities.

#### Must I have a dedicated campaign account?

Oregon law requires you to establish a dedicated campaign account if you are required to file a Statement of Organization. The account must be established in a financial institution located in Oregon that ordinarily conducts business in Oregon. One important reminder—when establishing your campaign account, the name of the committee and the name of the account must be the same.

# Candidate "Quick Guide"

#### How do I file?

The key to complying with campaign contribution and expenditure disclosure requirements is to keep detailed records and file your transactions on time.

#### **Electronic Filing**

Oregon Election law requires that campaign finance transactions be filed electronically. The Secretary of State's Office provides an electronic filing system, ORESTAR, free of charge. There is a terminal located in the Election's Division office for public use.

#### What if I don't own a computer?

A Statement of Organization (SEL 220) and Certificate of Limited Contributions and Expenditures (PC 7) may be filed using the paper forms. If you are not eligible to file a Certificate, contribution and expenditure transactions must be reported electronically using ORESTAR. You may want to check with your local library or other public facilities in your area to see if they provide a computer terminal for public use.

## When do I report contribution and expenditures?

Generally, the deadline for filing a transaction is not later than 30 calendar days after the date of the transaction. For committees active in an election, beginning on the 42<sup>nd</sup> day before the date of the election and through the date of the election, a transaction is due not later than 7 calendar days after the date of the transaction. The campaign finance reporting requirements and additional transaction deadlines are available in the Campaign Finance Manual. Information on how to electronically file transactions is detailed in the ORESTAR User's Manual: Transaction Filing.

#### Are my campaign finance transactions public record?

Yes, after the transactions are filed in ORESTAR they are immediately available to the public by accessing the Public Search link for ORESTAR.

# How do I discontinue my committee?

In order to discontinue your committee, you must: (1) Achieve a zero balance and (2) File a Statement of Organization discontinuing the committee.
